(6 points) The “Later No Harm” criterion is satisfied if, in any election for a particular voting method, a voter (or group of voters) giving an additional ranking or positive rating to a less-preferred candidate can not cause a more-preferred candidate to lose. For example, the Bucklin method *fails* Later No Harm, which you can see from this example:

Number of voters	8	2	4	6	3
1st choice	A	B	C	D	D
2nd choice	C	A	D	B	C
3rd choice	D	D	B	A	B
4th choice	B	C	A	C	A
